



Georgan Browning, Director of the Village of Hope

For over 16 years, Georgan Browning has been employed by the Orange County Rescue Mission, a non-profit organization serving the Least, the Last and the Lost of Orange County. Beginning in 2008, Georgan was promoted to the position of Director of the Village of Hope. She is responsible for the management and administration of the Village of Hope facilities, residents, clients, staff, volunteers, special events and programs.

Prior to this position, from 2003-2008, Georgan was Director of Human Resources where she directed paid and volunteer staff, responsible for preparing and processing payroll, hiring, counseling, terminations, maintaining job descriptions, benefits, new employee orientation, and updating the Employee Ministry Handbook on an ongoing basis.

From 1993 to 2003, Georgan was employed as the Accounting Supervisor, and then was promoted to Controller. As Controller, she supervised the Accounts Payable and Receivable Departments, prepared monthly financial statements, annual budgets and maintained record keeping for an annual audit with an outside accounting firm. Georgan also prepared and processed Payroll for the organization.

Prior to her employment with the Orange County Rescue Mission, Georgan was actively involved in founding a trucking company that is still in operation today. While there, she managed the office operations, worked in customer service, and oversaw the process of dispatching trucks for deliveries and pick-ups in the Southern California area.

Georgan also spent seven years in managing operating and accounting systems of radio stations located in Orange, CA, Phoenix, AZ and Denver, CO under the umbrella of the Interstate Broadcasting Systems.

Born and raised in Southern California, Georgan now lives with her husband Russell, and their son Brandon in La Habra, California.
